We all love the great British countryside, and spoiling the view is a crime.

Did you know you have a legal responsibility to make sure that all waste from your household is disposed of correctly? If your waste ends up fly-tipped, you can be prosecuted.

Here are some ways you can get rid of your unwanted goods responsibly:

- Make sure that people who collect your waste are registered waste carriers. Ask for their waste carrier number and a receipt which includes the business address. Phone 03708 506 506 to check their status.
- Take it to your local household waste recycling centre – visit your local authority's website for details.
- Arrange collection of difficult items e.g. fridges by your local council.
- Give away what you don't need through Freecycle™ – it's a great way to recycle unwanted goods and saves them going to landfill www.freecycle.org
- Donate unwanted goods to charity or local community furniture projects. Some charities even offer a collection service.
